

Global Outreach Day New Zealand 2017 Proposal

INTERNATIONALLY:

Global Outreach Day (G.O.D.) is the largest evangelism-mobilisation effort in human history. It is currently just 5 years old, initiated by 2 Germans. See www.globaloutreachday.com

NEW ZEALAND:

There will two parts to the G.O.D. effort in NZ

1: Pastors/Church leaders will be encouraged to mobilise members to connect the gospel with at least one person (Pg 1 and 2 of this info pack)

2. Regional training + outreach days will be offered to serve those who feel ready to 'reach people they don't know' (noting that no 'method' of evangelism is ever outdated. Bad people skills are outdated)

(Pg 3 of this info pack, with proposed programmes found on Pgs 4 and 5)

1: Pastors/Church leaders are encouraged to mobilise members to connect the gospel with at least one person

Churches/members can find ways to engage with their friends/community, seeking to utilise connections to create conversations opportunities in which they might encourage faith.

Global Outreach Day Ideas for local churches

Personal one-on-one approach

Invite someone

invite a friend, colleague or neighbour for coffee, to lunch or barbecue etc. and share your personal story how you met Jesus.

Practical help:

Offer to go shopping, give someone a ride, help out in your neighbours yard, wash someone's car, clean the house, mow the lawn. If you have special skills, offer them for free: financial counsel, repairs, etc.

Teams and groups

Creative Evangelism

Creative drama, sketches, dances, artistic presentations – use unusual gifts and ideas to draw the attention of the people and then share the message

Flashmob

Start a flashmob that gathers people and then spread out together to talk to the people why you did it.

Churches & Ministries

Larger Events

Gospel concerts, street or kid's festivals, creative dramas or arrange a larger gospel campaign in your city together with other churches

Neighborhood, street & district campaigns

Reach complete areas with strategic home to home, block for block or area specific campaigns

Use Media

Gospel Media Tools

Share gospel booklets, books or tracts, hand out DVDs with testimonies and healings, use media to open a conversation

Internet

Link your unsaved friends to web platforms that share the gospel, send them video clips, use Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, chat with them etc.

Some core values by which we encourage all participants to operate

To guide the manner with which we represent Christ in what is now a multi-religious society.

Conversational approach vs confrontational approach

With understanding of oru culture we ask questions more than we talk. We seek to understand where people are at – so as to purposefully encourage them. We 'discuss' rather than 'tell'.

Clarity

We make the most of every opportunity (Ephesians 5:16). We adapt, becoming 'all things to all people so that by all possible means we might save some' (1 Corinthians 9:22). We communicate fearlessly/unashamedly (Ephesians 6:20, Romans 1:16) – explaining the reason for the hope we have to all who show interest(1 Peter 3:15), because, 'if we do not attempt to tell them, how will they know' (Romans 10:14)?

Gentleness (1 Peter 3:15)

Instead of stating our disagreement and causing possible tension, we learn to affirm what is good, while asking questions about what we 'don't understand.' This is about people-skills.

Respect (1 Peter 3:15)

Because we live in a multi-racial and multi-religious society, we speak well of other religions and people who we might disagree with. We use '1' statements, and – while explaining clearly the reasons why we believe what we do – we also affirm with our mouth and manner our respect of all people irrespective of their views, and of the free-will God has given all people to choose their own view.

Authenticity

We find ways to engage with people that are authentic for us, with other people's interests at heart - not like a sales pitch with an agenda.

As OAC evangelists, we are well trained and equipped to train and equip all who want to verbalise their faith on that day and organise outreach for those who would like to participate in what I call 'GO events.' These are basically outreaches in streets, parks etc and even door-to-door with surveys. The plan is as follows.

1. Understanding the gospel and evangelism

2. 'With gentleness and respect...' - Not knocking over the

beehive to get the honey

3. Transitioning to the good news - The power of good questions.

30minutes.

4. Picking ripe fruit. Discerning genuine readiness to receive

Christ and closing the sale. 30 minutes.

1 x 1hr training for church leaders/elders/pastors

5. Preparing the church for growth

8am 'GO Team' breakfast and prayer

10am 'GO teams' go out

4 pm 'GO teams' meet for report back, prayer and praise.

(3) Sunday 28th May Option: Gospel Service option at café or church.
