


A lot of people feel that way. There are a lot of things in life that don't make sense, and God can seem pretty hard to find at times.

Having evidence to support what you believe is only sensible


...but in balance to that, to quote an old saying,

Reason /:


Contrary to criticism, the Bible documents




Did you know that the New Testament documents (of the Bible) are the most reliable ancient documents on our planet? This book is more accurately preserved than Shakespeare's plays - which are only 300 years old!

Sir Frederic Kenyon, former head librarian for the British Museum and one of the leading experts in the field of manuscript evidence in his day, said, "The interval then between the dates of the original composition and the earliest existing evidence becomes so small as to be in fact negligible, and the last foundation for any doubt that the Scriptures have come down to us substantially as they were written has now been removed. Both the authenticity and the general integrity of the books of the New Testament may be regarded as finally established."1

That's an academic way of saying - the Bible today is the same as when it was written.







The evidence for God's existence is **STRONG**

 Science cannot explain how life began.

 Many scientists rejoice at confirmation of an initial big bang but every effect needs a cause.

 Science has discovered machinery inside cells that is more complicated than previously imagined. The idea that we are the result of accidents of chemistry is convincing fewer and fewer academics.

Even the prominent atheistic philosopher of the late twentieth century - Anthony Rew - recently gave up his atheism due to the mounting evidence that living things are designed.³

As British Astronomer Sir Fred Hoyle put it, the chance that higher life forms might have emerged randomly is comparable to the chance that "a tornado sweeping through a junk-yard might assemble a Boeing 747 from the materials therein".4



Humans don't seem to be able to fix humans **PROBLEMS**

It seems we need help!

In the last hundred years we've seen more than ninety million people murdered under Communism⁵ - and they believed they were making the world

better. Communism is just one example of the

sufferings caused by humans in the last century!

We humans seem incapable of sustained good.

true evils have been done in the name of Christianity, these were contradictory to Jesus' teachings on love. Of note, evils done in the name of many other religions were consistent with their core beliefs. But, whatever the case, it remains that all of our hearts are corrupted. We keep doing selfish things!

It's not that our national leaders' ideas for fixing our planet's problems are always wrong - it's that we humans keep messing them up. Our history keeps repeating itself. We seem incapable of saving ourselves by ourselves.

As such, Christianity passes an important reality check. It says that our hearts are corrupted, that we need help, and then offers that help.

Reason 5:

Belief in God enables wrong to be wrong, and **JUSTICE** to exist


Our human minds are like amazing computers, and are programmed with a sense that right and wrong exist. Yet, if there is no God, there is no basis from which to say what is right or wrong - it's up to a community's or individual's personal choice!

This is why we feel sex outside of marriage is now considered acceptable (our culture decided), but also why Communist and Nazi leaders believed that they were doing nothing wrong when they killed all those people last Century (their culture decided).⁷

Unfortunately it is a package deal. If morals are up to us to define, we will define them differently, so such evils can't be avoided!

Reason 6:

It shows there is an ultimate **MEANING** to life

Old-time Christianity tells of a God

who made us with purpose. As such we're not cosmic accidents, and what we do in life has long-term

implications!
(Much longer

term!)

The Bible tells us,

"I the Lord search the heart and examine the mind, to reward a man according to his conduct, according to what his deeds deserve." - God

(as quoted in Jeremiah 17:10)

That makes all of life meaningful!

Every thought and every deed suddenly counts!

Reason 7:

It brings significance to life

We all want to believe that our lives are significant, but on what basis do we believe this? If 'God' is a 'cosmic force' that pervades everything, we are of the same worth as a fly because we are equally made from the same 'God-force' stuff. Or if there is no God at all, we are accidents of chance. In such views, a human has no more intrinsic value than an animal.

In contrast, Christianity gives a basis for human value. It says we were created in the image of God (Genesis 1:27). This is what gives dignity to human life (as separate to animals). Humans were the pinnacle of God's creation.

The phrase in the image of God can't refer to our bodies, because God is spirit. So it refers to something unseen, something inside us. God gave humans a 'spirit', a 'soul', a mind, a will...

"O Lord, you have searched me and you know me... Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? ... For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb... All the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be." — King David (Psalm 139)

This is why disabled people should be cared for rather than discarded (as does happen in some parts of our world?). This is why we should protect the dignity of the underprivileged, the poor, and the elderly - because everyone matters!

Who wouldn't want to believe that?


Reason 8:

It brings an inner security through suffering (and death)

An amazing story is told of Jesus sleeping in a boat right through a storm. His disciples were seasoned fishermen, but were terrified. So why did Jesus sleep peacefully in the midst of that storm?

It was because He knew that His heavenly Father (God) loved Him, so He knew that nothing could happen to Him that God didn't allow.

Faith that God's guiding hand is with us through life's trials makes a big difference. The Bible doesn't say we won't have trials - but that God will be with us through them. That perspective really changes things!



Reason 9:

It brings ultimate **HOPE** (the foundational Christian belief)

The core Christian message is about Jesus. Jesus was God coming to earth to die in our place.

To explain it: While our sins (wrongs) often seem a small matter to us, they are a big deal to God. It's like someone putting a drop of sewage in your cup of tea. It's a small thing, but makes a big difference. Our sin is a problem!

But because God loves us He went out of His way to make our forgiveness "Where, O death, is y O death is your sting? is sin... But thanks be the victory through ou

possible. That's what the Christmas and Easter accounts are about! Jesus died in our place. The penalty for our wrongs is now paid!

So, through asking for this forgiveness which Jesus enabled, our sins are forgiven forever, so we are...

- (a) ...restored to the status of being God's friends, and
- (b) ...restored to our purpose here on earth, and
- (c) ...assured of heaven as our eternal destiny, because we will be with our Big Friend.

Many people fear death, but faith in Jesus takes the sting right out of it!

Reason 10:

What have you got to **LOSE?**

Suppose there turned out to have been no God. You would have lost nothing through your religious endeavours, because at least you would have been good.

Suppose reincarnation turned out to be true. Again, you would have lost nothing. By choosing Christian faith you would have been a good person, and that would work in your favour for a better life next time around.

But suppose Christianity were true. It would be a very different story, because rather than denying the existence of things like wrong, sin and evil, the Bible says these exist!10

As such they need dealing with - and if they are not dealt with, that is a problem!

If Christianity is true then beliefs matter!

Where would you place your bet?

Which view makes best sense of our existence, and of the human condition?

IN CONCLUSION

Old-time Christianity is a source of comfort to countless millions - and the reasons are clear. Our lives gain significance, purpose and hope. The logical problem of selfishness (corruption) in the human heart is addressed, and the fear of death is removed!

The Bible says that God loves you, and it says that He proved this love when He went the 'extra mile' by coming to earth as a human to die in your place.

It really is the best news ever!

Some basic **HABITS** of Christians

- 1. They read the Bible to find comfort, and learn God's ways.
- 2. They talk to God (prayer) because God does listen and respond! While there are reasonable limits (He doesn't often answer selfish prayers) God does hear and respond!
- 3. They go to a Church to learn about God from others and find friends who can encourage faith.
- 4. They love and serve others including sharing of this hope He offers because this is what following Jesus truly looks like!

This is the greatest of contradictions, and maybe the strongest evidence of the corruption of the human heart, for in no other major religion is such corruption and killing more clearly defined as being wrong! Christian belief goes as far as saying that uncontrolled or unjust anger is the same to God as murder, because these are the motive it comes from. Indeed the human heart is corrupt!

The text infers it is a small change, but we note that the effects are culture-wide, and statistics speak clearly.
