## (iv) Where it went wrong in Church history? IN AD 313

Emperor Constantine issued the Edict of Milan, officially tolerating the church and ending the persecutions.

## In AD 323

Emperor Constantine started to build church buildings after the Roman forum. Believers that met underground now began to meet exclusively in these big buildings.

## About AD 400

Emperor Theodosius made Christian the state religion and suppressed all other religions.

As a result, many who called themselves Christians had no born-again experience.
