Thinking Matters is a NZ-based 'reasons' (apologetics) ministry. In 2024 they have six conferences.



The importance: We are still generally losing about two-thirds of all young adults from our churches, while a lack of KNOWN reasons for believing this faith to be true is an identified primary factor. Thinking Matters exists to help us change that.

Marriage Week: Sunday 8 - Saturday 14 September



This week exists in our calendar to REMIND US TO CELEBRATE MARRIAGE AS A CULTURE, to renew marriage vows, to attend a marriage seminar, arrange a special date night or weekend - or bless a younger couple who need encouragement.

Big picture notes:

- In many Northern hemisphere nations this is celebrated in February, aligned with Valentines Day.
- 3 years ago this was shifted this to the second week of September for us in the south, because February is otherwise too busy with beginning-of-year activities.

For local application:

- Question for churches together:
 - What support and or encouragement are we offering to our cities regarding marriage, pre-marriage, parenting toddlers/children/teens, or in divorce recovery... etc.?
 - To make that practical: Could the idea of a united approach amongst churches to offer to the community a 'wide compliment' of these options - promoted to all letterboxes / in the local newspaper?
 Read the idea in an article titled, 'Family relationships - an under-utilised gateway' <u>here</u>.
- Question for each church: What resources and ideas exist from Christian ministries in NZ that could be utilised to help people releasing individuals in our congregations for whom Marriage and Family is a primary passion while we make new community connections at the same time?

(ii) Spheres of influence Quarterly discussion guide

This is a highly catalytic idea, if we want to foster a united 'city perspective' in the church leaders of our city or town.

The question:

What are our churches and people doing in this area in our city? (2 areas + a season each quarter).

The purpose and benefits:

These have been articulated in prior updates - so we won't repeat here.

TERM THREE FOCUS AREAS:

- 1. The agricultural, farming and business sectors
 - Seasonally, spring represents the beginning of the agricultural season, and also of the start of the primary sales season for many businesses.
- 2. Family noting National Marriage Week is in Term 3...
 - What services do churches provide in your city/town to support families / marriage / parenting / divorce recovery, etc.

Hearing what churches and their members are doing will encourage and inspire.

All who hear will be empowered to speak for what God's Church (united) is doing in the city - in that area. This knowledge and perspective *SHIFTS the thinking and standing of that leader in the city!*

(iii) 'In unison' strategies (Things to encourage in view of wider vision)

The most effective unity efforts will be those in which we unite in common goals *rather than specific methodologies - even while big events feel more spectacular.*

Ideas we could embrace in common to make a difference This article lists 4 goal areas, with 14 applications which each church could do their own way — yet that could make a broad impact in our nation if these were to become the habits of 1500 churches.

But how can 2500 pastors be mobilised 'in unison' to shift something nationally? The answer is 'through someone encouraging them to do so' - like you.

Four optional starting areas of national vision: See four overarching national goals - with 14 associated leadership habits or values that can be encouraged - by clicking on the image.

- There is a level of momentum in each area listed.
- It only grows in as much as people in leadership positions like your own see the vision - thereby 'feeling' when momentum in an area of practice is low

amongst a group of churches, *thus bringing a small word of encouragement to change that!*

We pray this is useful for clear vision and ideas that bring life to your churches together.


