The purpose:

"We are gathering to respond to the need of our generation. Thousands will come together on this day and <u>be activated into their missional and evangelistic</u> <u>calling</u>. <u>The time of spectator Christianity is over</u> and our simple obedience can change history."

After the event:

As participants respond to serve, with responses collected, they will be proactively fed back to their own communities and churches to find ways in which they could serve.

For your encouragement, a few thousand have already responded in various ways via regional meetings.

Hope Project Christmas

Consider: It was logically always going to be the role of Christians to keep the CHRIST in the cultural festival of CHRISTmas.



This goal of Hope Project Christmas is <u>not</u> so much that churches put up nativity scenes, <u>but more-so that all churches encourage their MEMBERS to take</u> <u>initiative</u>.

- This way the initiatives of tens of thousands can be activated.
- This is how we impact culture and cultural perspectives together.

"The most significant impact of the united Church will come about when the members of various congregations are united with vision across a community - not merely their leaders."

Summary notes for promotion:

- The nativity story naturally arises from a nativity display.
- Christmas carols are the most loved of all Christian songs by the public.
- If we don't keep the 'Christ' in 'Christmas' no-one will do it for us.

2. 'Gather 25' ... is a globally united prayer event - 1st March 2025

About and why:

- A globally united prayer for a harvest.
- "Every continent; every denomination; across 25 hours"

The below details are passed on from Sanjai.

To summarise the vision:

- "For the first time in history, technology will connect the global Church in ways that were never before possible and a gathering of this proportion is going to be monumental."
- "We're going to pray for the world and for each other, worship together, and hear how God is moving in His Church–everywhere. This is going to be an EPIC 25 hours like you've never seen. And we want you there!"

To do what:

 "Gather25 will be an opportunity for the 2.5 billion believers across the world to gather in prayer, worship, and repentance, so that we can go out powerfully and collaboratively to reach the world."

For application:

- In each and every location (small or large), gather people together to pray on 1st March.
- Pastor's in about 20 NZ cities are being contacted currently while all cities and towns are encouraged to host a united prayer gathering.
- Please head to <u>Gather25.com</u> to have more information and to tell us you're in.

Auckland and the international telecast: It is NZ's honour that the Gather25's 25 hour global prayer starts from Auckland on 1st March 6pm for three hours after which the telecast will move to Singapore. This will be broadcast globally on every platform available so that people can participate from anywhere and everywhere.

3. Possible discussion amongst pastors re 2025

How might God's Church be engaged and represented in your city/town in 2025? (Copy / paste / edit to suit yourself).

Term 1

February - Waitangi: Will churches be present / involved in Waitangi gatherings / events with the wider community? Other hopes / goals? What interesting local and national history stories could be uncovered, valued and told to congregations - as also on various public platforms?
"Gather 25" - will you do something together on 1st March 2025?

2. Easter

- Note again: There is no Hope Project booklet delivery or TV ads as noted above.
- What could churches do individually and together?

Other spheres of influence for possible united engagement

3. United prayer? What of the vision of your <u>members</u> being united to pray in every possible work place and school? What patterns would you like amongst yourselves as church leaders? Any combined church prayer gatherings? Possible participation with the international 'Gather 25' initiative - via a prayer gathering for the harvest on 1st March?

4. In support of youth groups? What could you do to enhance the unity of youth leaders and strength of their outreach - to see youth united in prayer and action in their schools, with combined youth events to support?

5. Wider hopes and goals together for your city/town?

Re no Hope Project Easter booklet in 2025: Why, and an option.

This pause is purposed to allow the Shining Lights Trust to give focus to other areas of gospel innovation and resourcing.

- 2026: The hope is to begin again with fresh media Easter 2026.
- **Prayer walking could continue:** While there is no delivery to unite around, churches could still prayer walk city-wide.
- There remains a booklet option for some: Supplies of some prior booklets are available. There are sufficient to cover some towns or suburbs. Enquire via admin@shininglights.co.nz

(ii) Spheres of influence Knowledge changes perspective

The idea: <u>A single 'discovery discussion' somewhere in the coming 3 months</u>, covering 2 or 3 areas + 'upcoming cultural seasons/festivals' each quarter. By doing this you can meaningfully yet simply discuss through all 8 spheres in a year *thereby empowering the pastors with knowledge and perspective - to bless the city.*

A result: When your pastors stand to speak in the community they can now stand

as someone representing the efforts of the wider Church - instead of only their own particular congregation.

• These conversations can yield significant fruit.

TERM FOUR FOCUS AREAS:

The question to ask regarding each sphere / season: What are our churches and people doing in this area in our city?

1. <u>SEASONS</u>: Christmas - There is no limit to the creativity you can engage with in your community.

- As a starting point, what are churches, their members, Christians in business, Launchpad (Bible in Schools) volunteers in schools etc... <u>already</u> doing?
- As above, the idea of 'Hope Project Christmas' could then help everyone to get creative to engage around the story of Christ Jesus.

2. <u>SPHERES</u>: Media and creative arts - How are God's people engaging in these spaces locally?

3. <u>A FRIENDLY CONCLUSION TO THE YEAR</u>: Thanksgiving for the year that

has been - Thank God together in prayer for all he has done in your <u>churches</u>, your <u>members</u> and in the <u>city</u> this past year.

To encourage the wider body:

- Who could you pass on a note of 'thanks' to as a group of pastors to encourage or thank them?
- What 'success stories' of things your members (or church) have done for your city this past year could you each share with your congregations?

When we hear stories of courage it makes us bolder.

(iii) 'In unison' strategies Unity is about working smarter - not harder

The purpose of this brief section is to remind us of simple goals that we could unite to pursue in our congregations - while each doing this our own way. This can shape a united culture amongst our members. Together, they can exert an influence on the wider society and culture.

Each goal listed below could also be applied through a leadership HABIT *that sits within the scope of what we already do as church leaders.* So this is no more work to do than not to do - other than the intentionality involved in establishing your ongoing shared vision.

"If the output resulting from our unity is extra programs, we might soon become tired of it. However, if it could instead be about shared goals, we could each go to shape the thinking and practice of our <u>members</u> - and they could unite to impact the entire city!"

For example, what if in 20 years...

- Our core messages were still being heard – despite cultural hostilities
- 2. Our members were better equipped to engage difficult conversations
- Our members were engaging with increased cultural wisdom, knowledge and story
- 4. The Church as a whole was also stronger in prayer?

Ideas we could embrace in common to make a difference

This article lists 4 goal areas, with 14 applications which each church could do their own way — yet that could make a broad impact in our nation if these were to become the habits of 1500 churches.


Faith in Action Report

The LID of our unity is in what we can SEE

Provocative new article from Dave Mann

In this article I suggest that unity in NZ could yet go places it has never been in our brief history. I also believe this is God's heart and desire for us all - together.

However, more than this, I suggest the *wisdom* needed for this journey sits amongst us. I suggest the path toward our 'new destination' together *sits in the culture we create amongst ourselves - not in an increase of events and activities. It is principally about augmenting the way we think.* Different thinking will naturally produce different actions and possibilities - with results.



However, there is a limitation. A leader can only take people to a destination they can SEE. If we cannot SEE how things could be different, we cannot get there.

I therefore conclude that most pastors' groups are about 20 intentional (and specific) conversations away from being positioned to <u>SEE</u> how things could be different.
